We had 20 attendees on this cold January evening.

Chuck Half from the Mayor's Office attended this meeting.

Our president Brad Palmisiano was out sick. Misi Bielich, our vice-president, opened the meeting. She introduced two new neighbors who were present and we welcomed them warmly.

Then Misi outlined plans for new and brighter street lighting on Mission Street from 18<sup>th</sup> St. to Sterling St. SSSNA will also be asking our State Representative Harry Readshaw for a grant for safety lighting for the steps from Mission Street down to South Side Park.

Misi then introduced Ms Sarah Newman from *Neighbor Works of Western PA*. Ms Newman outlined the work that her organization does for Western PA. This includes:

- Counseling on purchasing or refinancing a home;
  - Credit counseling;
  - New homebuyers classes – dos and don'ts;
  - Foreclosure counseling.

Misi then turned the meeting over to Peter Kreuthmeier, an Executive Board member, to lead us in a process for updating our list of areas of concern for Slopes neighbors. These areas include: Steps and Railings, Sidewalks, Streets, Litter and Dumping, Gardens, Signs, Retaining Walls, Parking, Playgrounds, and Enforcement Issues.

We discussed some of these concerns, then prioritized several concerns needing immediate attention.

The meeting adjourned by 8:20 PM.

## NOTES ON THE FEBRUARY MONTHLY MEETING OF SSSNA

22 neighbors attended the Meeting. Our Board President Brad Palmisiano introduced Chuck Half from the Mayor's Office who was in attendance. Brad welcomed new Slopes neighbors who have moved here from Cranberry. Brad then presented an update on several items:

- Our Welcome Bags are now ready... if you know a new neighbor in the Slopes get in touch with a member of our Board and we will get a Welcome Bag for the new neighbor.
- Membership Renewal is underway now... \$5 for the year for individuals and families.
- Our Newsletter is still in transition.
- South Side Soup Contest takes place on Feb 23<sup>rd</sup>. This is for the benefit of the Brashear Association.
- The Board has passed our SSSNA 2009 Budget. A detailed Budget is available upon request.

- We need volunteers for neighborhood clean-ups on March 15, 28 and April 4... from 9 AM til Noon.
- Project updates:
  - Mission Street Lights have been replaced by brighter lights.
  - The Josephine St. *Draft Survey* is complete and the Board will now prioritize our projects on Josephine St.

Brad introduced Judy Dyda from SSLDC who led a discussion on the updated *Community Plan*, and the role of SSSNA in the items of that plan, including what needs attention from neighborhood infrastructure. The SSSNA Board will now prioritize these items, deal with them as best we can, and stay in communication with the City regarding them.

## FINANCIAL NEWS

The South Side Slopes Neighborhood Association finished 2008 in solid financial condition. A lot of the credit goes to a very successful 2008 Pittsburgh StepTrek. The proceeds from the annual event cover many of the expenses incurred by the organization over the course of the year.

Total revenues were \$22,122 while expenses were \$14,595. Among the larger expenses were supplies for maintaining the gardens and conducting neighborhood cleanups, printing and copying for the newsletter and the StepTrek booklet, insurance for the organization and tee shirts for the StepTrek.

SSSNA continues to depend upon the dues paid by members. We appreciate the financial backing of residents and friends who support the mission of the organization.
