Outreach Committee Trash Update

The Outreach Committee continues to work on illegal trash storage issues as directed by Slopes residents through a community wide survey. Considered a serious issue with health and safety ramifications, it is being dealt with through education and monitoring. Besides, it's ugly!

The committee will resume door to door visits to distribute city trash storage rules (These aren't suggestions-they're the law!). Focusing on 10 properties at a time, and with the support of Councilman Bruce Kraus, 311 will continue to be the main resource for reports of continual violators. Dealing with absentee landlords can be a challenge and the group is focusing on tools to educate and monitor them as well.

Because this is such a comprehensive initiative, we need your help. Consider the following:

Occupancy Violations



The SSSNA and the Outreach Committee are listening to our neighbors concerns regarding violations to occupancy codes in our neighborhood. As we all know, too many individuals living in rental properties poses many problems in the slopes to include parking, trash, and safety. The code states no more than 3 unrelated individuals living in a single dwelling.

Though the enforcement of codes has proven difficult and frustrating to many, we must all be vigilant on this issue to ensure that the Bureau of Building Inspections enforces their codes in the Slopes. Violations of occupancy, building permit, weed, debris, sidewalk and trash regulations can result in fines for the property owners. We encourage neighbors to document the number of cars attached to problem properties when filing a complaint with the BBI. Photographs of cars and unkempt properties are helpful in supporting your concerns.

- Must own and have lived in your home for the past three years;
- Your household income must fall at or below 150% of HUD's Poverty Guidelines.
 All residents in the home must report income;
- Property taxes must be current.

Since 2006, a group of Slopes residents has been trying to communicate with various individuals at Duquesne University about the significant impact of the Rooney Field lights on our neighborhood. Because these lights are in sharp contrast to surrounding light levels, they have become a quality of life issue for many residents. The group has offered to work with DU toward a solution. Councilman Bruce Kraus has supported these efforts. After installing some shields in 2012 that did not address the problem, Duquesne has refused all requests for more action to remediate the impact of their lights on the Slopes. This response has been particularly curious as DU has touted its green initiatives since at least 2008.

At this point, the group would like to gauge the interest and concern of all Slopes residents regarding solving this problem. Obamacare Assistance Available

If you need to purchase your own health insurance because it is not provided to you by an employer, Certified Health Insurance Navigators from the Allegheny Intermediate Unit are available to meet with you and help you navigate the Healthcare.gov website. (Obamacare)

Our Navigators will be able to assist you in applying for tax credits to lower your monthly premiums and other cost saving subsidies you may qualify for. The service is free. Please contact Beth Newman at 412-576-3297 for additional information.

Remember, the open enrollment for "ObamaCare" ends March 31. If you can afford health insurance, you will be required to have purchased insurance or will the charged the Individual Responsibility Requirement when you file your 2014 tax return. The fee for 2014 will be \$95/adult or 1% of your income.





Hilltop Residents Reclaiming Vacant Lots



Since October, 13 Hilltop Residents have been working with GTECH Strategies on their ReClaim South Program to reclaim 13+ vacant lots in the South Hills. After months of classroom study and site research, these projects are almost shovel-ready.

In the South Side Slopes, we have 2 projects to look forward to. David Totten, a South Side Slopes resident, is creating multiple "Little Free Libraries" throughout the Hilltop including the Barry Street Garden in the South Side Slopes. This project combines David's love of reading and public transportation by placing these tiny libraries in public area gardens and near bus stops.



SSSNA Board Member, Cara Jette, is working on the Knoxville Incline Historic Route on the border of Allentown and the South Side Slopes. This project is beautifying a blighted area along Brosville Street with new trees, planters, and a trail. Jamie Balser, another Slopes resident, has been acting as a mentor for all the projects.
