

Grant Funding Update: Josephine Street

Improvements:

Thanks to a generous grant from our State Representative Harry Readshaw for \$15,000 and another grant from State Senator Jay Costa for \$15,000, SSSNA will be making streetscape improvements to Josephine Street to address safety and beauty concerns. There are many issues that need to be tackled, so we will do what we can with the money allotted and continue to pursue additional monies until our vision for this important South Side corridor is realized.

The area next to the sidewalk between 23rd and 24th Street is terribly overgrown and neglected such that passage through on the sidewalk is limited.



We have some ideas in the works to install a permanent landscaping solution for this area. Also, our wonderful brick sidewalk promenade and the maple trees that line Josephine could use some sprucing up.

Further, because the underpasses tend to collect garbage and become overgrown and unsightly, in order to showcase entry into our neighborhood, we hope to turn these neglected gateways into a complimentary part of the streetscape. We may need to institute an Adopt-A-Trestle program.

We also see 21st Street and Josephine Street as an important intersection to be highlighted, as 21st Street leads right into our 64 acre South Side Park. That is a whole other project which SSSNA is currently undertaking to bring OUR PARK back to a great amenity for residents.

Lastly, because there is no sidewalk along Josephine Street from the 2400 block down to the 2600 block, this creates a hazardous situation for pedestrians who are forced out into the heavily traveled street. SSSNA will begin petitioning the City for a new sidewalk there. We will keep you updated.

We are excited about the work ahead of us, and if you are interested in being a part of any of these projects please contact Janice Serra at 412-381-5855. There are many ways you can get involved with the Slopes organization no matter what your age or abilities - we can use your help!

SSSNA has already accomplished many projects along Josephine:

- SSSNA worked with several partners to install new sidewalks and safety lighting under each railway trestle that are the entry point to the South Side Slopes
- SSSNA and Public Works partnered to reveal the brick sidewalk which was

- buried under ages of collected dirt and weeds
- SSSNA and The Pittsburgh Shade Tree Commission partnered to install 54 Tartarian maple trees (unfortunately eight of these have been run over or died)
- SSSNA partnered with Western Pa. Conservancy and the Pittsburgh History and Landmarks Foundation to create and maintain Community gardens at Barry and Josephine; Greeley and Josephine; 18th and Josephine
