The evening of September 11<sup>th</sup> was a two part event which began with a moving Rededication Ceremony...



SSSNA President Brad Palmisiano (above) began the Ceremony where more than 100 neighbors were present on Pius Street. Brad thanked Judy Dyda from SSLDC for coordinating the striking renovation of the Soldiers Memorial. He then thanked Elm Street Committee Members Misi Bielich and Dawn Lorincy for planning the Rededication Ceremony.

After the attendees recited the Pledge of Allegiance, with an American Legion Honor Guard present, Linda Walsack beautifully sang *God Bless America*. State Representative Harry Readshaw (above), City Councilman Jeff Koch, and Kim Graziani from the Mayor's Office spoke briefly, thanking our Neighborhood Association for planning and coordinating the attractive renovation of the All Wars Memorial.

The flag flew at half-mast in honor of 9/11. The American Legion lowered the flag to the accompaniment of Taps sung by Linda Walsack, followed by bugles playing Taps. (continued pg 2)

#### SSSNA Meeting 9/11

September's SSSNA meeting was held in the Auditorium of Veronica's Veil at 44 Pius Street. Over 50 people attended the meeting. Officials attending the meeting included State Representative Harry Readshaw, City Councilman Jeff Koch, Kim Graziani from the Mayor's Office, Police Chief Nate Harper, Paul Loy Bureau of Building Inspection, and Parks & Recreation Director Duane Ashley. SSLDC Director Rick Belloli also attended. Mayor Luke Ravenstahl arrived a bit late to give his presentation.

Speakers covered a number of topics before the Mayor's presentation. Bruce Kraus encouraged Slopes residents to attend the Zoning Board hearing on the opening of *Angel's Night Club* on Josephine Street. The hearing will be on October 11<sup>th</sup>, 9:00 AM at 200 Ross Street downtown. Paul White announced a Veronica's Veil fashion show fundraiser at Highland Park on Sunday, October 7<sup>th</sup>.

Janice Serra from the SSSNA Board briefly addressed some issues the South Side Planning Forum is discussing, including the need for South Side organizations' input to a proposed closing of 29<sup>th</sup> Street between Carson and Carey Way, to accommodate the construction of an office Building. Judy Dyda updated Elm Street activities, including the opening of a renovated gateway garden at Brosville and Monastery Streets at 11:30AM on Saturday, October 6<sup>th</sup>. Refreshments will be served. (*see pg 5*)

Parks and Recreation Director Duane Ashley gave an update of the suggested uses of the old ice rink at South Side Park. Over the years 20 proposals have been presented, including four newer proposals submitted since the May RFP.



Mr. Ashley (*left*) stated the newest proposals have been underwhelming, especially with regard to funding plans. There will be a new RFP issued soon, looking for more substantial proposals. South

Side neighborhood organizations will have input in response to any new proposals. SSLDC will be involved.



Mayor Luke Ravenstahl (above) arrived and addressed those attending on some of his administration's accomplishments, including budget, city development, attracting new businesses and jobs, and neighborhood quality of life issues. These quality of life issues are high on the Mayor's priority list.

The Mayor noted that there will be more police officers by January 2008, bringing the force up to 900 officers.

The City will install more surveillance cameras in high crime areas.

A number of neighborhoods have applied for Weed and Seed funds to help fight crime and make the neighborhoods safer and more livable.

An opportunity for Questions and Answers followed. The meeting was informative and lively. Fr. Don Ware, C.P.

# How can I volunteer for the StepTrek?




#### Elm Street Committee
