South Side Voices: Share your story

South Side Community Council announces East Carson Street oral history project

In celebration of the 25-year anniversary of the City of Pittsburgh East Carson Street Historic District, the South Side Community Council (SSCC) has created **South Side Voices: Stories on Carson**. An oral history project, South Side Voices: Stories on Carson will focus on the rich histories of East Carson Street's buildings.

The project is in partnership with the Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh- South Side and with the cooperation of the Duquesne University History Department and the Pittsburgh History and Landmarks Foundation.

"We're looking for stories from anybody who really has a connection with the South Side— stories that connect with the historic buildings along East Carson Street," said SSCC board member Ed Wallo. "What we really want to do is thread those personal stories and family histories into the community."

Buildings of focus include the South Side Market House, South High School Apartments, Esser's Floral Shop, Club Cafe, Fat Head's Saloon and more, although any building that falls within the historic district is of interest.

The stories will be published on the SSCC's website and <u>Historypin.org</u>, with intentions of incorporating them into a public art project, a mobile app, and various South Side events throughout the year.

If you or someone you know is interested in sharing a story, attend a from noon to 4 p.m. on Sunday, Mar. 18 at the Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh-South Side. Participants are encouraged to bring old photos or articles about East Carson Street's historic buildings. Funding for the project has been provided by the Heinz Endowments.

South Side Park Master Plan process in the home stretch

Third community meeting scheduled for March 15

The South Side Park Master Plan is moving right along! The Design team has begun to translate community input into physical recommendations for South Side Park. The second community event, held at the Arlington Rec Center, provided attendees a chance to consider many types of enhancements for the park, which were based on the most consistent concerns and requests heard from the community. Designs were developed around three themes: environmental education, arts + history + culture and recreation + adventure.

Participants were not asked to choose between the three themes, but rather to identify the elements from each that they would like to see move toward one cohesive plan. Participants were also encouraged to report their overall feeling toward the design directions. Members of the consultant team and South Side Park Advisory Committee were available to walk folks through the schemes, answer any questions, and help record positive and negative reactions to various elements of the designs. Residents of Arlington, South Side Slopes, South Side Flats and Allentown dropped in to voice their opinions.

Aside from the design stations, participants enjoyed a lovely spread of The Other Diner sandwiches and cheeses generously sponsored by

the South Side Slopes Neighborhood Association, not to mention a stellar South Side Park (temporary) tattoo application station. A big "Thank You!" to everyone who helped make the second community event so successful!

What's Next? How can I be involved?






SSSNA REVENUE AND EXPENSES: 2017

City's 4th Division of Public Works searches for a new home

Just a few months after closing the condemned 4th Division of the Department of Public Works building, the Peduto administration and Pittsburgh City Council acknowledged a gap in services and announced that a search for a new location will be conducted.

The 4th Division serves southern neighborhoods, including the South Side Slopes. The aging facilities on Bausman Street in Knoxville were unsafe for both workers and machinery and had to be closed.

City officials hope to find a location by July 2018 and begin the process of planning and building the new facility.
