We have lit the 18th St. steps, painted miles of handrails, obtained and executed grants to repair stairways, cut the ribbon on The Knoxville Incline Greenway (the city's first new greenway in decades), removed literally tons of trash, constructed new trails in South Side Park, opened Bandi Schaum Community Gardens, planted trees, helped maintain houses for neighbors who were unable to do so on their own, permanently signed the Church Route, maintained acres of garden space, advocated for city services, erected entry way signs at many access points, and consistently have provided a voice for our neighborhood to anyone who wished to live or work here.

None of this was done by me, and every single day I am thankful for the diligent neighbors who have dedicated their time, sweat, tears, and blood to make the South Side Slopes the community that it is today. I encourage everyone to get involved with this organization, we bring ideas and projects to life through our work together. Join us for StepTrek and showcase this neighborhood for everything it is and can be on Saturday. Oct. 1.

# Oakley Street Mosaic Steps: A Community Success

Thanks to the efforts of more than 100 community members, the Oakley Street Mosaic Steps are being installed this month! About 2 years ago, a small committee formed to create a mosaic steps project in the South Side Slopes. We researched artists, potential locations, and sources of funding. After many meetings, we decided on artist Laura Jean McLaughlin, the Oakley Street Steps, and crowdfunding via the gofundme platform. Laura Jean McLaughlin was chosen for her whimsical designs, her excitement for working with the community, and her experience with outdoor mosaic tiles which can be seen at Whole Foods in East Liberty and the Pittsburgh Zoo. The Oakley Street Steps are a highly-trafficked set of steps near a

bus stop which will gain them high visibility. Everyone we talked to was excited about the project, and willing to put their money into it. The gofundme campaign raised \$4500 in 3 months.

Many of you joined us at Acacia for a happy hour fundraiser last summer, contributed to the gofundme campaign, or attended a design session. Over the winter, the committee went to Art Commission, ordered tile, and worked with the city to repair the Oakley Street Steps.

This summer, the real work began! The 77-step art installation will cover 200 square feet. It depicts a young woman standing in the Slopes amidst hillside homes, wildlife, and mill stacks blowing flowers instead of smoke. Each of the risers have been tiled diligently by enthusiastic volunteers from all over Pittsburgh over the past two months. At 7 weekly workshops, volunteers adhered tiny pieces of tile to the mesh framework of each panel following the artist's design closely. South Side Slopes resident, Marlene Gentilcore, called it: "Sharing stories, laughing and sticking our own fingers together with cement. What fun! Kindergarten all over again."

Now, we are in the final stages of the project. Each panel will be mortared and grouted onto the step risers by the artist, Laura Jean McLaughlin. Due to the dedication of the community to this tremendous undertaking, the project is on schedule to be installed in advance of StepTrek on October 1.

## **Knoxville Incline Greenway Ribbon Cutting**

On Aug. 20, a group of more than 20 people celebrated a new greenway at the sit e of the former Knoxville Incline at a ribbon-cutting. Cara Jette, board member of the South Side Slopes Neighborhood Association, led the yearslong endeavor from the intensive clean-up and eventual greenway designation.

The site off Brosville Avenue was the former site of the Knoxville Incline (1880-1960). The city-owned land was designated a greenway in August — the newest in the city. Visit the parklet and enjoy this peaceful slice of history on the Slopes!






