Launched in 2018 by a local, new parent, South Side Kids is a social group located in Pittsburgh's South Side neighborhoods that serves as a resource for parents and caregivers to stay connected. It works as a support system bringing awareness to the growing number of families raising little yinzers dahn sahside.

Since its inception, South Side Kids has created a variety of activities for kids and caregivers to enjoy. From free pumpkins to Santa Claus visits to rock art to the Trick or Treat Map, this group works to attract and retain families in our area.

The group received media attention in early 2020 for the South Side Bear Hunt. Adapted from the book We're Going on A Bear Hunt, residents around every corner adorned stuffed animals to their windows and doors giving the kids something to "hunt" for while walking around the neighborhood. Following the success of the Bear Hunt, South Side Kids launched the Art Rock Snake at the base of the Iron Workers sculpture by the river, the successful art installation attracted Pittsburghers from all over. The snake was recently adopted by Pittsburgh Phillips Elementary and is on display in their kids garden.

#### Get outside! South Side Park is waiting for you

This time of year is a perfect time to explore South Side Park. If you're not sure where it is, Google it....it's closer than you think! (and, there is a lot to see and enjoy). Read on to find out what is happening in the park.

- **Trail development** An accessible, ADA trail near Bandi Schaum Community Garden is currently going through City approval process. LaQuatra Bonci Associates designed the trail and is guiding FOSSPark through the process. Friends of South Side Park is currently fundraising to construct the trail. To donate, visit FOSSPark.org/donate.
- Park reforestation In Jurassic Valley and in the wooded area to the west of the Valley is ongoing. There has been considerable tree loss in the wooded area in recent years. To counter that, since 2018, 467 trees and shrubs have been planted in the park. Your help is needed to help manage the areas that have been previously cleared of invasive plants. - **Tree planting** TreeVitalize awarded the park 20 landscape-size trees for planting this spring, including five redbuds for Bandi Schaum Drive. Planting day is Saturday, April 30. To help with.
- GOAT FEST 2022 This year's event is happening Saturday, July 30 at the Arlington Ballfield behind the Arlington Fire Station, from noon to 4 p.m. Live music, food trucks, youth activities and the not-to-be-missed Allegheny GoatScape goats are part of the fun. - Tree News Visual artists Erin Mallea and Paper Buck moved to Pittsburgh in 2016 to attend Carnegie Mellon's MFA in Visual Art Program. As artists, their individual and collaborative work is rooted in site-specific research approaching land, ecology and place as social sculptures and archives of relation. In 2020, they began Tree News, a newsletter focused on tree and forest stories as entry points to conversations about climate change adaptation, ecological orientations in art practice and environmental justice. 

#### Looking back at 2021: Treasurer's recap

After a rough 2020, we managed to hold two successful parties in 2021 as well as return to an in-person StepTrek. Highlights of our 2021 budget were:

- To celebrate the 21st Anniversary of StepTrek, the SSSNA paid for 7 bands to perform along the routes. Our biggest fundraiser was still very successful for the neighborhood association!
- SSSNA received a \$2,500 grant from the CDBG for communications with neighbors.
- After StepTrek, our biggest expense is Outreach. That category includes 3
  mailings to all neighbors in the Slopes, our summer picnic catered by La
  Palapa, our holiday party hosted by The Zenith, and 100 calendars to sell
  as a fundraiser and give away to new neighbors.
- Finally, we paid for a Wetlands study in South Side Park to allow for the design of an ADA trail behind Bandi Schaum community garden.

We hope to spend more money in 2022 with more volunteer days and inperson meetings! Here is an overview of our deposits and debits for 2021:
